ARRIVAL DUBLIN, TRAVEL TO ENNIS

On arrival at Dublin Airport we will be met by our local coach and guide. We will then travel to western Ireland, breaking our journey en route with a visit to Birr Castle Demesne in Co Offaly. From here we make our way to Ennis, where accommodations for the next three nights will be the Old Ground Hotel (www.flynnhotels.com/Old_Ground_Hotel/). This hotel is located in the heart of this historic town and was formerly an 18th century manor house. It has been recently refurbished to a very high standard. Dinner will be served in the evening.

Day 2 Thursday 3 June 2010

ENNIS

After breakfast we drive the short distance to the **Cliffs of Moher**, perhaps Ireland's most dramatically impressive natural attraction. We then drive into **The Burren** and the beautiful valley of the River Caher, where from dense hazel and blackthorn scrub Carl Wright has created a wonderfully varied plantsman's limestone garden, **Caher Bridge Garden**, in the true "cottage" style. We have the treat of exploring **The Burren** with Carl. We return to our hotel where dinner is served in the evening.

Day 3 Friday 4 June 2010

Following breakfast, we visit a private garden at **Vandeleur** where many tender and unusual plants thrive in this area's unique western latitude microclimate. In the afternoon, we visit **Knappogue Castle**. This garden is in contrast to Vandeleur and very distinctly Victorian. We return to hotel in time for dinner.

Day 4 Saturday 5 June 2010

ENNIS TO KILLARNEY

We check out of the hotel this morning after breakfast and continue travelling southwards to **Knockpatrick**, featured in the April 2008 "The Irish Garden" magazine overlooking the Shannon estuary. We then continue towards Foynes, where **Boyce's Garden** overlooks the Shannon. This garden is a continuing winner of the Limerick/Clare Garden of the Year Award. It is designed for year-round colour and is notable especially for a profusion of southern hemisphere plants. From there we head further southwards to the banks of the River Shannon where we visit **Glin Castle Gardens**. The dashing romantic castle looks northwards to the Shannon on one side and to its own well-wooded demesne on the other. Following our visit here we travel north into Killarney to our accommodation for the next two nights at **Dunloe Castle** (<http://www.dunloecastlehotel.com/>), a luxurious modern hotel in tranquil surroundings, set against the back drop of the magnificent Gap of Dunloe. Thanks to the very mild climate, there are some unusual species here, including the South American *Lomatia ferruginea*. Others are of particular Irish interest, such as the lovely hornbeam *Carpinus benryana*, introduced by the great Irish plant hunter Augustine Henry. In addition to the trees, there are many beautiful, and often rare, plants to be admired. Dinner is served in the evening.

Day 5 Sunday 6 June 2010

KILLARNEY

After breakfast, today we tour the **Ring of Kerry**, a journey through some of the country's most outstanding scenery around the Iveragh peninsula. At Caherdaniel we visit **Derrynane House**, the

ancestral home of one of Ireland's greatest statesman, Daniel O'Connell. The house has been preserved as a museum of the life and times of the man known as 'The Liberator', who played an major part in securing Ireland's independence from Britain. The sub-tropical plantations and garden walks around the house are delightful. We will stop for lunch (not included) at the **Sheen Falls Hotel**, which has a lovely wild garden of its own. Dinner is served back at our hotel.

Day 6 Monday 7 June 2010

KILLARNEY TO CORK

This morning, after breakfast, we check out of the hotel and travel down to Bantry Bay, where we take the ferry across to Garinish Island to visit **Inacullen**, surely one of the high points of our visit to Ireland. Inacullen, commissioned from Harold Peto, was made for Annan Bryce in 1910. The elegant Italianate folly overlooking a sunken garden is familiar from countless photographs with the Caha Mountains behind. The beauty of Inacullen comes from its wonderful intermingling of the formal and the wild. We will also visit **Kilravock** at Durrus, the private garden of Malcolm and Phemie Rose. Dunmanus Bay and has been featured on television and in several national and international publications. The garden has a viewing platform, indoor fernery with water features, Mediterranean garden, woodland area with collections of Hostas and Acers and many southern hemisphere plants. Later we will continue to our accommodation at the 4-star **Imperial Hotel, Cork** (http://www.flynnhotels.com/Imperial_Hotel/). This well known hotel has played host to several well-known guests including Sir Walter Scott, Charles Dickens and the composer, Liszt. Dinner will be served at the hotel in the evening.

Day 7 Tuesday 8 June 2010

CORK

Following breakfast we leave the hotel to visit the lovely old fashioned private garden of **Demesne** at Castlemartyr. We then drive to the Woodleigh Park suburb of Cork where we will visit **Ballymaloe Cookery School Gardens**. Our final visit of the day is to **Cedar Lodge**, an award-winning garden of two acres, specializing in rare and unusual plants with mixed borders of shrubs and herbaceous perennials. We return to the hotel for dinner.

Day 8 Wednesday 9 June 2010

CORK TO DUBLIN

This morning after breakfast we check out of the hotel and head south, stopping en route at the **Irish National Stud and Japanese Gardens** in Kildare. Now of international renown and acclaimed as the finest Japanese Gardens in Europe, they are a living monument to the meeting of Eastern and Western cultures in a Western setting. We will then visit the garden of **Carmel Duignan**, a gardening writer and former television producer who has created a beautiful garden. A self-confessed plantaholic, she has amassed an extraordinary collection of plants. Following our visit, we check in at our hotel, the deluxe Gresham Hotel, (<http://www.gresham-hotels.com/>). Dinner is served in the hotel in the evening.

Day 9 Thursday 10 June 2010

DUBLIN

This morning we begin with a visit to **Hunting Brook**, home of the former head gardener of Airfield Gardens in Dundrum. Hidden in the foothills of the Wicklow Mountains near Blessington, the garden is a plantsman's paradise with contemporary borders, creating a fusion of prairie and tropical plantings in a natural setting. Hunting Brook is now home to Ireland's largest collection of ornamental grasses with over 200 different species and cultivars. We continue to **Powerscourt**, which is more of a vista than a garden. It is a magnificent example of an aristocratic garden with herbaceous borders and ornamental lakes, but it is the view that makes Powerscourt so special - the Wicklow Mountains with the garden in the foreground is stunning, and once seen is never forgotten. Our final visit today is to **Corke Lodge**. The house was built in the 1820s to designs by William Farrell as an Italianate seaside villa and a Mediterranean grove was planted with a Cork tree as its centrepiece. You are on your own for dinner this evening.

Day 10 Friday 11 June 2010

DUBLIN

This morning after breakfast we will travel to the **Dillon Garden**, a well-known favourite of ours. Helen Dillon is a world-renowned plantswoman, writer, lecturer and broadcaster who, together with her husband Val, has created a garden that is considered to be one of the gems of the horticultural world. Next, we have a real treat when we visit **Mount Usher**, a lovely informal garden which dates back to 1850. The garden was inspired by Irish gardening maverick William Robinson who eschewed formal Victorian bedding schemes in favour of a more naturalistic style. We return to the hotel in time for dinner in the evening.
